Indian Nursing Council has revised, and developed syllabi under section 16 of the INC Act, in order to ensure uniform standard of Nursing Education in the Country.

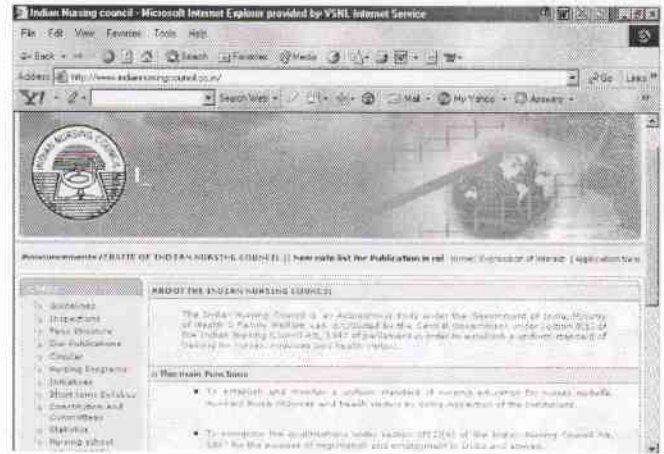
While revising, or developing the syllabus INC has taken into consideration, sound educational principles, changing health needs, the current health trends of the country and thrust of National Health Policy.

Institutions are required to follow the INC syllabi and to keep all the publications of INC in their library for references. Practical record book has to be maintained by each student, which can be procured by Indian Nursing Council. A copy of the priced publication is herewith enclosed.

2. **Revised Guidelines for School of Nursing & College of Nursing.**

- Any organization under the Central Government, State Government, Local body or a Private or Public Trust, Mission, Voluntary registered under Society Registration Act or a Company registered under company's act wishes to open a School/College of Nursing, should obtain the No Objection/Essentiality certificate from the State government.
- The Indian Nursing council on receipt of the proposal from the Institution to start nursing program (School/College), will undertake the first inspection to assess suitability with regard to physical infrastructure, clinical facility and teaching faculty in order to give permission to start the programme.
- After the receipt of the permission to start the nursing programme from Indian Nursing Council, the institution shall obtain the approval from the State Nursing Council and Examination Board/University.
- Institution will admit the students only after taking approval of State Nursing Council and Examination Board/University.
- The Indian Nursing Council will conduct inspection every year till the first batch completes the programme. Permission will be given year by year till the first batch completes.

#### **4. Teaching Faculty-**

- Many of the teaching faculty are leaving the institution during the middle of the academic year, which affects the implementation of curriculum and students will be put into inconvenience. It is, therefore, in case teachers who will be leaving in middle of the academic year such teaching faculty will be brought under the **disciplinary action by the State Nursing Council** and also they may be considered for withdrawal of license after following due procedure.
- Age of nursing teaching faculty should be maximum **65 years**. 2 (Two) years can be extended only in the case of medically & physically fit faculty.

#### **5. Change of Address**

- Maximum of 2 times change of address is accepted and more than 2 times change of address will not be considered. And as per INC norms, institution should have its own building **within two years** of establishment.

6. **Revised GNM Syllabus :** Implemented in all States from 2005-2006 academic year.

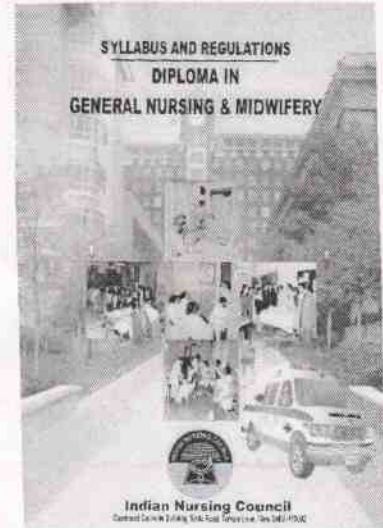
- Internship added
- New subjects introduced
- Increased duration from 3 to 3½ years

**Admission Criteria of GNM :**

- Minimum and Maximum age for admission will be 17 and 35 years respectively. For ANM/LHV, there is no age bar.
- Minimum education:
  - a) 10+2 class passed or its equivalent preferably with Science (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) subjects with aggregate of 45% marks.
  - b) Those who have cleared 10+2 vocational ANM course (revised after 2001) from the school recognized by Indian Nursing Council.
  - c) ANM training i.e. 10+1 ½ years training should also have passed +2 or its equivalent examination.
- Admission of students shall be once in a year.
- Students shall be medically fit.

**Indian Nursing Council is not responsible for the students if admitted more than allotted.**

- INC has prepared the Guide for School of Nursing. The revised Guide gives a direction to nursing teachers with model of unit planning, course planning & planning for clinical practice and evaluation both theoretical and clinical.
